Message from the Board Chair and the CEO

Is there ever a dull moment at the Children's Wish Foundation? The past year was action-packed as we celebrated our 30th anniversary and marked over 22,000 wishes granted since we launched in 1984.

As we honoured the incredible history of Children's Wish, we also took action to position ourselves for an even more incredible future. We rolled out a new brand program, which included a new website and marketing materials to bolster media outreach and awareness of Children's Wish. As always, our wish kids were our best ambassadors. One child in particular – our "G-Man", Garrett Gamble – did so much to raise our profile. During his one-day stint as a Toronto Maple Leaf, Garrett captured the hearts and minds of Canadians across the country.

Another notable development was our decision to broaden the range of children to whom we grant wishes. Eligible wish children with life-threatening illnesses now include those with serious genetic and neurological diagnoses. This significant step forward is in response to requests from the medical community. Because of advances in medical science, many children with serious illnesses such as cerebral palsy are surviving into adulthood. But they also face incredible day-to-day struggles that include challenges with mobility or movement as well as feeding, speech or other communication difficulties. Many are dependent on their family or caregivers for most or all aspects of their daily care. Healthcare professionals tell us how urgently these children need the healing hope provided by a wish. We are listening, and responding.

As we look to the year ahead, we feel incredibly proud of the profound impact Children's Wish has had on millions of Canadians in communities across the country. We have brought joy and respite to thousands of children and families, often during the toughest times in their lives. We provide much-needed support to the medical community, and healthcare professionals are increasingly referring patients to us. We bring donors, volunteers and support groups across Canada together – uniting for a common cause.

But there is so much more that needs to be done. We anticipate a 20% increase over the next eighteen months in eligible referrals of children with life-threatening genetic and neurological diagnoses. We need additional funds to address this new group of deserving children, so this year we are launching a major giving campaign. To accomplish our ambitious goals amid a challenging fundraising climate, we will continue strengthening our relationships with donors and supporters. Together, we will elevate awareness about the critical work we do.

These are truly exciting times for Children's Wish. We are so grateful to our supporters and partners: donors, volunteers and members of the medical community. Your efforts day in and day out allow us to grant deserving children an opportunity to escape their medical challenges and enjoy precious time with their families. Thanks to you, we will continue bringing communities together to make a child's wish come true.

This year, teams competed in 15 locations to raise a total of **\$1.3 million**. Exile Island has generated nearly **\$7.8 million** since 2007 for Children's Wish.

▲ PRINCESS TEA PARTY

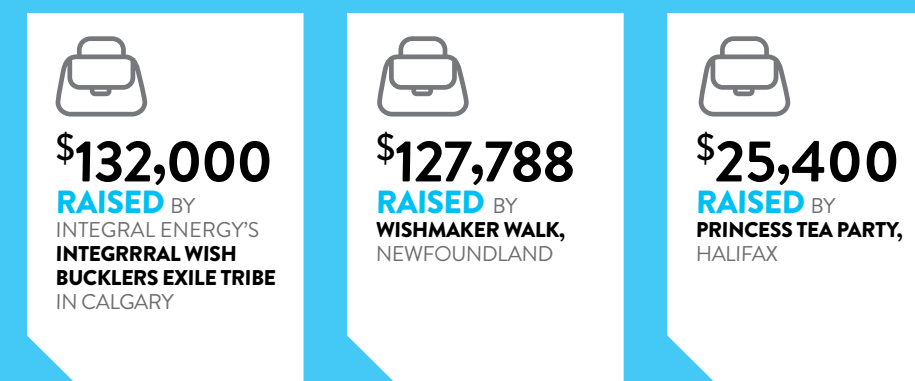
Children's Wish supporters understand the power of a fantasy, and they put it to good use at our Princess Tea Party fundraising events. Hosted in ballrooms decorated like a fairy tale palace, these events – which featured formal tea service, entertainment and a princess parlour – raised nearly **\$400,000** for Children's Wish since 2009 and **\$51,576** in the last year.

▲ WISHMAKER WALK FOR WISHES

Wishes really do come true – one step at a time. In 2014, about 2,500 participants in nearly **60** communities across Canada put on their walking shoes and hit the road for the Wishmaker Walk for Wishes. They raised more than **\$753,124** from these annual fall events, which has drummed up over **\$11.7 million** nationwide since 2005 to help grant wishes to Canadian children.

We feel so honoured to have this amazing mother of two and grandmother to five kids as an ambassador for Children's Wish.

WISHING IT FORWARD

After Darcy McRae's special wish came true, he thanked Children's Wish in one of the best ways possible: by wishing it forward. Darcy was diagnosed and hospitalized with a brain tumour two years ago. During this difficult time, Children's Wish granted his dream of going to France with his family. Once he was healthy again, Darcy – now 13 years old – rallied his schoolmates to raise money for other wish children. He and his friends made bracelets, hosted bake sales, walked dogs and held sporting events. Together, they raised \$10,000 for Children's Wish.

NATIONAL BANK LENDS ITS SUPPORT

Children's Wish volunteer communities aren't just made up of individuals, they also include corporations such as the National Bank. To encourage its employees to volunteer, the bank created a program where for every hour an employee gives towards a community cause, it would donate one dollar to an organization devoted to children's well-being selected through an internal survey. This year, the Children's Wish Foundation was chosen. The result: employees volunteered 100,000 hours of their time, raising \$100,000 for Children's Wish. TREASURER'S REPORT

In our fiscal year ending March 2015 we achieved total revenue of \$24.0 million compared with \$24.9 million from the previous fiscal year, which reflects a number of challenging economic conditions across the country and an increasingly competitive environment for donor support.

But as we look ahead our financial needs are greater than ever. Over the last decade, we have seen a 22% increase in wish children referrals. We expect further increases, with a 20% rise in wishes in the next eighteen months from referrals of children with life-threatening illnesses, a group which now also includes kids with serious genetic and neurological diagnoses. Already, more than 70% of our reserves have been put aside for approved children who are either awaiting completion of treatment or have not yet chosen their wish.

To ensure our ongoing ability to grant at least three wishes a day every day of the year, we are diversifying our revenue sources. We built on the success of our popular fundraising events – such as Exile Island and Wishmaker

Walk for Wishes – and will be launching new initiatives such as our Major Giving program.

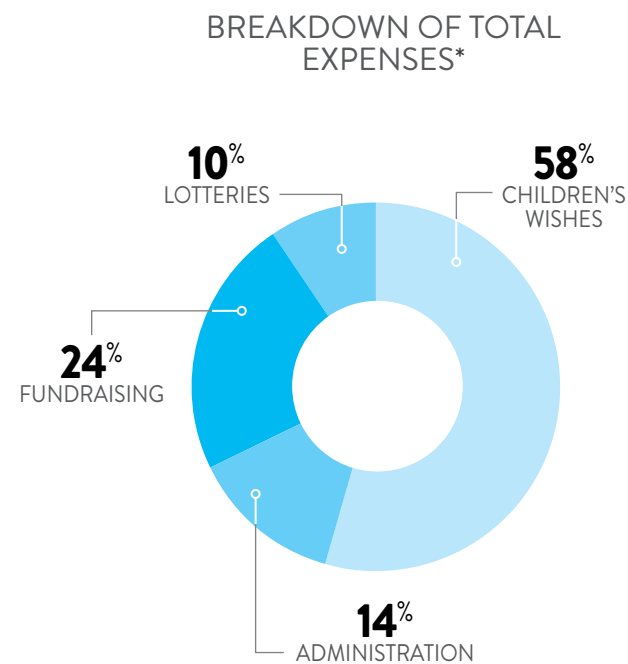
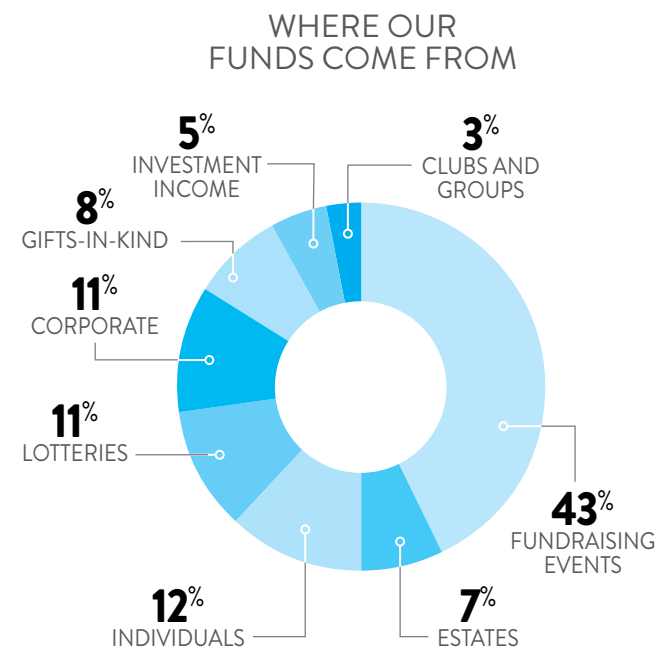
As we continue to manage through difficult times, we remain firmly committed to transparency, accountability and careful stewardship of our donors' dollars – a commitment underlined by our accreditation application with Imagine Canada's Standards Program for responsible financial management and reporting for charitable organizations. Our overall fundraising ratio is 34%, but that decreases to 27% after factoring out isolated costs and revenues associated with our lotteries. Our administrative costs ratio stands at 14%.

The numbers tell only part of the story. As told through the smiles and words of our wish kids, their families and

our communities at large, the rest of the annual report provides a more complete account of the magnitude of our impact.

This was a challenging year, and we anticipate even more challenges as our revenue needs continue to grow in step with the growing group of children who need our help. We look forward to another busy – and exciting – year as we work together with communities across Canada to bring the healing power of a wish to many more children and families. We thank you and hope we can continue to count on your support.
